Aboriginal Place Naming Workshops continuing into 2019



Council's new loge depicts four shields imposed over the outline of the State of Victoria. The shields represent supporting, respecting and celebrating our land, culture and life. The colours of the shields represent the four environments that make up our Country – gold and ochre represent desert sands and dry country, green for the forests and grasslands, blue for the waters, rivers and lakes and the purple colour represents our metropolitan regions as well as the basaltic and volcanic plains.
