


## (Victorian) Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006 (The Act)

- The Act provides for the protection of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in Victoria. It does this through:
- Establishment of the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Council
- Establishment of the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Register
- Development of the Cultural Heritage Management Plan (CHMP) process &
- Cultural Heritage Permit processes for the management of activities which may or is to impact on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage
- Provisions for sanctions and penalties to prevent non-sanctioned harm to Aboriginal Cultural Heritage
- Powers granted to Authorised Officers and Aboriginal Heritage Officers for the protection of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage



## Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Council (VAHC)

- VAHC was established in 2007
- Traditional Owner only Council as appointed by the Minister
- VAHC appoints Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPS) which are the Traditional Owners of their Country &
- Oversee RAP operations
- Ancestral remains reporting, management & return to Country
- VAHC is the TO voice which advice to the Minister on cultural heritage







- RAPs are Traditional Owner groups, legally recognised under the Aboriginal Heritage Act (as appointed by VAHC), with responsibilities for managing and protecting Aboriginal Cultural Heritage on Country.
- RAPs are the primary source of advice and knowledge on matters relating to Aboriginal places or Aboriginal objects on their Country. RAPs core functions include:
- evaluating Cultural Heritage Management Plans
- assessing Cultural Heritage Permit applications
- making decisions about Cultural Heritage Agreements
- providing advice on applications for interim or ongoing Protection Declarations
- entering into Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Land Management Agreements with public land managers
- nominating Aboriginal intangible heritage to the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage
  Register and managing intangible heritage agreements

## Legislative Reform to improve protections of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage(VAHC)

- Council has published a discussion paper on legislative reform
- Some of reform positions include:
- Furthering Self-Determination of RAPs
- Increasing Autonomy of VAHC
- Recognising, Protecting and Conserving Aboriginal Cultural Heritage
- Reforms aimed at further transparency and transference of relevant decision-making authority to Traditional Owner groups (RAPs)
